# **HOMEWORK POLICY**

Assignments will be accepted if turned in late, however there will be a 10% reduction in score for each day late. Per WCHS academic policy there will be *NO EXTRA CREDIT* opportunities. Instead, students can retake assessments to improve their academic standing.

#### **MAKE-UP WORK FOR ABSENCES:**
