HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework will be assigned in this course. Students will be expected to turn in their assignments on the date due unless they are absent. Assignments will be accepted if turned in late, however there will be a 10% reduction in score for each day late. Per WCHS academic policy there will be <u>NO EXTRA CREDIT</u> opportunities. Instead, students can retake assessments to improve their academic standing.

MAKE-UP WORK FOR ABSENCES:

Student should schedule a time with the teacher to make up any missing exams.

The district policy states that make-up is one day for each day absent.

**Example: The student is absent on Monday (maroon day) and returns on Wednesday. The work on Monday will be due Friday. Or if student is absent on Tuesday (silver day) and returns Thursday, the assignment will be due next Tuesday. All assignments can be found in Google Classroom (traditional) and/or School PLP (traditional/remote)
