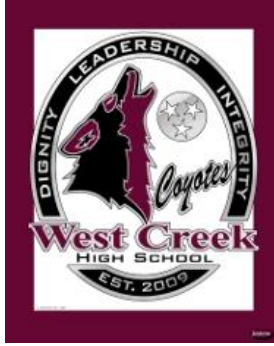

The chart below outlines the units of study for Criminal Justice I and possible major assignments or field trips that could be used to enhance student learning or solidify mastery of standards in each unit. This chart is not inclusive of every assignment for (content area), as additional or different assignments may be created based on the needs of students. Specific details for major assignments will be shared with students and parents or legal guardians as the standards related to the assignments are addressed in class.

1	Safety	Rules related to operating and using Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and attachments.	August 08 – September 02

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2	UAS Industry and Occupational Awareness	Research and summarize origins, developments, evolution, laws, regulations, and industry publications for Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and attachments	September 06 – October 07
3	Airspace Classification and Operating Requirements	Analyze technologies, platforms, and systems to determine capabilities and limitations of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and attachments	October 17 - November 18
4	Map Reading	Understand and interpret information obtained from sectional charts, aeronautical charts, and chart of supplements	November 21 - December 02
5	Performance, Weather, and Restrictions	Preflight planning, use of weather reports, and understanding human operating errors	December 05 – December 09
6	Payload, Stressors, and Data Collection	Examine rules and regulations thru Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)	January 09 – January 27
7	Career Opportunities	Find the association between criminal justice and Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and attachments	January 30 – February 17

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8	Written and Oral Presentation	Analyze fundamentals and principals of flight in written and oral presentation	February 21 – March 03
9	Communication in Criminal Justice	Communicate Pilot in Command (PIC) responsibilities (i.e. interpretation of charts and data collected)	March 13 – March 31
10	Radio Communication	Demonstrate effective communication using proper radio procedures and having knowledge of aircraft communication equipment	April 03 – April 21
11	Document Scene using Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS)	Gather and report intelligence based on legal guidelines (i.e. use of a Search Warrant)	April 24 – May 19

## **HOMEWORK POLICY**

Homework will be assigned in this course. Students will be expected to turn in their assignments on the date due unless they are absent. Assignments will be accepted if turned in late, however there will be a 10% reduction in score for each day late. Per WCHS academic policy there will be **NO EXTRA CREDIT** opportunities. Instead, students can retake assessments to improve their academic standing.

## **MAKE-UP WORK FOR ABSENCES:**

Student should schedule a time with the teacher to make up any missing exams.

The district policy states that make-up is one day for each day absent.

**\*\*Example:** The student is absent on Monday (maroon day) and returns on Wednesday. The work on Monday will be due Friday. Or if student is absent on Tuesday (silver day) and returns Thursday, the assignment will be due next Tuesday. All assignments can be found in Google Classroom (traditional) and/or School PLP (traditional/remote)
